

MISSED HEARING SCREEN

Remember "1" in 1-3-6

 Initial hearing screen by one month of age

Refer to Pediatric Audiologist

 Use Tennessee Pediatric Audiology Directory to find closest pediatric audiologist.

Expect a "No Hear" Letter

The State Program will send a "No Hear" letter to parents when baby misses an initial hearing screen.

CONFIRMED HEARING LOSS

Remember "3" in 1-3-6
Diagnostic hearing evaluation by 3 months of age

Report to State NHS Program

 The NHS Program will accept reporting in any format. Fax: 615-532-8555 or Phone: 1-855-202-1357. Please indicate audiologist, if known.

Refer to ENT

 To recommend treatment and receive medical clearance for amplification

Ensure Regular Audiologic Evaluations of Hearing Loss

Birth to 3 – Every 3 months
Age 3 to 6 - Every 6 months

Remember "6" in 1-3-6

 Ensure child is enrolled in early intervention services by 6 months.

Make Other Referrals

 Genetic, Vision, Early Intervention, Parent -to Parent Connection



RISK INDICATOR

Expect an "At-Risk" Letter

The NHS Program sends an "At-Risk" letter to parents and physicians when a risk indicator is reported by the birthing hospital.

Refer to JCIH '07 Statement

 Outlines risk indicators for hearing loss.

Ask Parents, Again

 Risk indicators are not always reported accurately before hospital discharge.

Ensure Audiologic Evaluations

The TN NHS Audiologic Guidelines recommend audiologic follow-up every 6 months until age 3 for children who exhibit a risk factor.
